## 3. 'Sharing the Vision' at Hallé St Peter's - a thank you




In February 2014 well over two hundred people gathered to hear about our vision for the Dispensary when the Ancoats Dispensary Trust hosted the fantastic free public event 'Sharing the Vision' at Hallé St Peter's. Supporters and stakeholders were all treated to the acappella sounds of Golden Voices, Manchester's only senior choir, contrasting beautifully with the young voices and lyrics of the very talented Brighter Sound. With heritage displays, a merchandise stall, art exhibits by AWOL Studios and delicious food, there was also a performance by actor and Patron John Henshaw who as auctioneer managed to raise a massive £700 for a beautiful exclusive work of art by urban landscape artist Julian Bovis. Julian also generously donated ten limited edition prints of the Dispensary that quickly sold raising a further £500 towards our funds. A variety of speakers each spoke about the Dispensary from their own perspective, including a pre-recorded message of support from Lucy Powell -Manchester Central's first and only female Member of Parliament. Other performers on the night included the Leos Strings Quartet and Master Chu's Lion Dance Troupe. Our thanks must be expressed to all the hard working student volunteers, our speakers, the audience and everybody else who supported this event in any way shape or form! Manchester Metropolitan University have won a £46,000 Collaborative Skills Training Award, and Ancoats Dispensary Trust are one of the groups who will begin working September 2014 - May 2015 with the university in research to discover how we could record particular periods of history relating to Ancoats and its close neighbourhoods.
